Passato Remoto

Finding the Pattern

It can be helpful to find a pattern for any verbs with irregular *passato remoto*, as it helps to remember them. This list is **NOT** complete.

As in dictionaries, you will find the first and second person singular (*io, tu-* [I, you]) with those you can easily complete the conjugation.

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Some commonly used irregular verbs in passato remoto

Please note that this is **NOT** a complete list of irregular *passato remoto*.

Only the first and second person singular will be indicated but the examples will have various ending to show how 'regular' the *passato remoto* is once you know how to follow the pattern for *io/lui-lei/loro* vs. *io/noi/voi*

Some common irregular verbs in -ARE have irregular <i>passato remoto</i>			
Infinitive	Passato remoto 1st and 2nd person singular	Example	English
<i>dare</i> [to give]	<i>diedi/detti</i>	<i>Mi diede un passaggio.</i>	She gave me a ride.
<i>fare</i> [to do/to make]	<i>feci/facesti</i>	<i>Feci un dolce.</i>	I made a cake.
<i>stare</i> [to stay/to remain]	<i>stetti/stesti</i>	<i>Stettero a casa.</i>	They stayed home.

Dare [to give]

	Dare
<i>io</i>	<i>diedi/detti*</i> [I gave]
<i>tu</i>	<i>desti</i>
<i>lui/lei</i>	<i>diede/dette*</i>
<i>noi</i>	<i>demmo</i>
<i>voi</i>	<i>deste</i>
<i>loro</i>	<i>diedero/dettero*</i>

Fare [to do/make]

	Fare
<i>io</i>	<i>feci</i> [I did]
<i>tu</i>	<i>facesti</i>
<i>lui/lei</i>	<i>fece</i>
<i>noi</i>	<i>facemmo</i>
<i>voi</i>	<i>faceste</i>
<i>loro</i>	<i>fecero</i>

* You can find/hear both, but *diedi* is more common



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Many commonly used verbs ending in -ere have irregular passato remoto			
Infinitive	Passato remoto 1st and 2nd person singular	Example	English
<i>bere</i> [to drink]	<i>bevvi/bevesti</i>	<i>Beveste molta acqua.</i>	You drank a lot of water.
<i>difendere</i> [to defend]	<i>difesi/difendesti</i>	<i>Difese la sua idea.</i>	He defended his idea.
<i>dividere</i> [to divide]	<i>divisi/dividesti</i>	<i>Divideste la torta.</i>	You divided the cake.
<i>esprimere</i> [to express]	<i>espressi/esprimesti</i>	<i>Esprese la sua opinione.</i>	She expressed her opinion.
<i> fingere</i> [to pretend]	<i>finsi/fingesti</i>	<i>Finsero di partire.</i>	They pretended to leave.
<i>leggere</i> [to read]	<i>lessi/leggesti</i>	<i>Leggemo un bel libro.</i>	We read a good book.
<i>mettere</i> [to put]	<i>misi/mettesti</i>	<i>Misi la borsa sul tavolo.</i>	I put the purse on the table.
<i>nascere</i> [to be born]	<i>nacqui/nascesti</i>	<i>Nacqui nel 1950.</i>	I was born in 1950.
<i>offendere</i> [to offend]	<i>offesi/offendesti</i>	<i>Mi offese.</i>	He offended me.
<i>piangere</i> [to cry]	<i>piansi/piangesti</i>	<i>Piansero di gioia.</i>	They cried with happiness.
<i>prendere</i> [to take]	<i>presi/prendesti</i>	<i>Prese l'aereo.</i>	She took the plane.
<i>perdere</i> [to lose/to miss]	<i>persi/perdesti</i>	<i>Perdemmo il volo.</i>	We missed the flight.
<i>ridere</i> [to laugh]	<i>risi/ridesti</i>	<i>Risero di cuore.</i>	They laughed heartily.
<i>scegliere</i> [to choose]	<i>scelsi/scegliesti</i>	<i>Sceglieste bene.</i>	You chose well.
<i>scendere</i> [to go down]	<i>scesi/scendesti</i>	<i>Scese con l'ascensore.</i>	He went down in the elevator.
<i>scrivere</i> [to write]	<i>scrissi/scrivesti</i>	<i>Collodi scrisse Pinocchio.</i>	Collodi wrote "Pinocchio".
<i>spegnere</i> [to turn off]	<i>spensi/spegnesti</i>	<i>Spense la luce.</i>	She turned off the light.
<i>spingere</i> [to push]	<i>spinsi/spingesti</i>	<i>Spingeste la porta.</i>	You pushed the door.
<i>togliere</i> [to take off]	<i>tolsi/togliesti</i>	<i>Tolse la giacca.</i>	He took off his jacket.
<i>vedere</i> [to see]	<i>vidi/vedesti</i>	<i>Vide un bel film.</i>	I saw a good film.



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Verbs like produrre [to produce] follow this conjugation			
Infinitive	Passato remoto 1st and 2nd person singular	Example	English
<i>produrre</i>	<i>produssi/producesti</i>	<i>Produsse tanto calore.</i>	He produced a lot of heat.
<i>condurre</i> [to lead]	<i>condussi/conducesti</i>	<i>Cesare condusse i Romani alla vittoria.</i>	Caesar led Romans to victory.
<i>dedurre</i> [to deduce/to infer]	<i>dedussi/deducesti</i>	<i>Deducemmo la verità.</i>	We inferred the truth.
<i>porre</i> [to place/to set/to imagine]	<i>posi/ponesti</i>	<i>Pose il vaso sul tavolo.</i>	She put the vase on the table.
<i>ridurre</i> [to reduce]	<i>ridussi/riducesti</i>	<i>Ridusse le spese.</i>	He reduced expenses.
<i>tradurre</i> [to translate]	<i>tradussi/traducesti</i>	<i>Tradussero la versione latina.</i>	They translated the Latin version.
<i>trarre</i> [to pull/to drag]	<i>trassi/traesti</i>	<i>L'uomo trasse in salvo il cane.</i>	The man saved the dog.





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Some common verbs ending in <i>-ire</i> with irregular <i>passato remoto</i>			
Infinitive	Passato remoto 1st and 2nd person singular	Example	English
<i>aprire</i> [to open]	<i>aprii/apristi</i>	<i>Aprimmo la porta.</i>	We opened the door.
<i>dire*</i> [to say/to tell]	<i>dissi/dicesti</i>	<i>Disse la verità.</i>	He told the truth.
<i>morire</i> [to die]	<i>morii/moristi</i>	<i>Morì nel 1867.</i>	S/he died in 1867.
<i>uscire</i> [to go out]	<i>uscii/uscisti</i>	<i>Uscimmo con gli amici.</i>	They went out with friends.
<i>venire**</i> [to come]	<i>venni/venisti</i>	<i>Vennero in treno.</i>	They came by train.

	Dare
<i>io</i>	<i>dissi</i>
<i>tu</i>	<i>dicesti</i>
<i>lui/lei</i>	<i>disse</i>
<i>noi</i>	<i>dicemmo</i>
<i>voi</i>	<i>diceste</i>

*Verbs that have "dire" in their infinitive also follow this pattern: *contraddire* [to contradict]; *benedire* [to bless], etc.

** Verbs that have "venire" in their infinitive also follow this pattern: *convenire* [to be useful], *divenire* [to become], etc.
