Common expressions used with the past perfect			
Time expression	Use	Example	Translation
<b>ya</b> already	To describe an event that happened before another. To express completeness of an event.	<b>Ya</b> había escuchado historias sobre este lugar.	I had already heard stories about this place.
<b>todavía no / aún no</b> not yet	They are commonly used in the negative when an event didn't happen prior to another event in the past.	¡La medianoche y <b>todavía</b> <b>no</b> habían empacado!	Midnight and they had not packed yet!
nunca never	To talk about the first time something is done.	<b>Nunca</b> había visitado esta parte de la ciudad.	I had never visited this part of the city before.
(poco) antes de + noun before	To describe an event or circumstance that marks the end or the completion of the activity in the past perfect.	<b>Antes del</b> embarazo había conseguido un ascenso.	Before her pregnancy, she had been promoted.
previamente / anteriormente previously, before	This adverb emphasizes the fact that these activities had occurred in advance.	<b>Previamente</b> , habían acordado encontrarse en el café.	They had previously agreed to meet at the café.
