Verbs with Prepositions

List of some of the most frequently used verbs followed by prepositions, it is NOT a complete list.

When in doubt, check the dictionary: it is your best friend!

Verbs followed by *DI*

Verb + <i>di</i>	Italian sentence	English translation
accettare <i>di</i> to accept	Accetto <i>di</i> scrivere il libro.	I accept the task of writing a book.
accorgersi <i>di</i> to notice	Mi accorgo <i>di</i> tutto!	I notice everything.
credere <i>di</i> to believe	Credo <i>di</i> capire la domanda.	I believe I understand the question.
decidere <i>di</i> to decide	Ho deciso <i>di</i> chiamare il medico.	I decided to call the doctor.
dimenticare <i>di</i> to forget	Dimentico sempre <i>di</i> prendere le chiavi.	I always forget to take the keys.
dispiacere <i>di</i> to be sorry	Mi dispiace <i>di</i> disturbare.	I am sorry to disturb.
fidarsi <i>di</i> to trust	Mi fido <i>di</i> lei.	I trust her.
finire <i>di</i> to finish	Ho finito <i>di</i> mangiare.	I have finished eating.
parlare <i>di</i> to talk about	Parli sempre <i>di</i> sport.	You always talk about sport.
interessarsi <i>di</i> to be interested in	Mi interesso <i>di</i> sport.	I am interested in sport.
pensare <i>di</i> to think (of doing something)	Penso <i>di</i> venire.	I'm thinking of coming.
ricordarsi <i>di</i> to remember	Mi ricorderò <i>di</i> te.	I will remember you.
sapere <i>di</i> to know	So <i>di</i> avere ragione.	I know I am right.
smettere <i>di</i> to stop	Smetto <i>di</i> parlare.	I stop talking.
sperare <i>di</i> to hope	Spero <i>di</i> vederti presto.	I hope to see you soon.
vergognarsi <i>di</i> to be ashamed of	Mi vergogno <i>di</i> lui.	I am ashamed of him.



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Expressions with avere [to have]

avere bisogno di to need	<i>Ho bisogno di aiuto.</i>	I need help.
avere fretta di to be in a hurry	<i>Ho fretta di arrivare.</i>	I am in a hurry to arrive.
avere paura di to be afraid of	<i>Ho paura dei topi.</i>	I am scared of mice.
avere voglia di to feel like	<i>Ho voglia di un cappuccino.</i>	I feel like having a cappuccino.



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Verbs followed by A

aiutare a to help	<i>Aiuto a pulire.</i>	I help clean.
abituarsi a to get used to	<i>Mi abituo a mangiare poco.</i>	I get used to eating little.
affrettarsi a to hurry to	<i>Mi affretto a comprare il pane.</i>	I will run to get bread.
assomigliare a to resemble	<i>Giacomo assomiglia a suo fratello.</i>	Giacomo resembles his brother.
cominciare a to start/begin	<i>Comincio a lavorare a maggio.</i>	I start working in May.
continuare a to keep/continue	<i>Continuo a studiare italiano.</i>	I keep studying Italian.
decidersi a to make up one's mind to	<i>Ti decidi a scendere dalla macchina?</i>	Can you make up your mind and get off the car?
finire a to end up doing something	<i>Sono finita a lavorare in un ufficio.</i>	I ended up working in an office.
*giocare a to play (a sport/game)	<i>Gioco a calcio.</i>	I play soccer.
imparare a to learn	<i>Ho imparato a scrivere a sei anni.</i>	I learned how to write at six.
iniziare a to start/begin	<i>Inizia a piovere.</i>	It starts raining.
interessarsi a to take an interest in	<i>Mario si interessa a lei.</i>	Mario takes an interest in her.
mettersi a to start doing something	<i>Mi metto a scrivere.</i>	I start writing.
parlare a to talk	<i>Parlo al telefono.</i>	I talk on the phone.
partecipare a to attend/participate	<i>Partecipo a tutte le conferenze.</i>	I attend all conferences.
pensare a to think (about/of someone/something)	<i>Penso al futuro.</i>	I think about the future.

* IMPORTANT

The verb *giocare a* is used ONLY when talking about playing a sport or a game,
NOT about playing an instrument!



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provare a to try	<i>Prova a dormire di più.</i>	Try to sleep more.
rinunciare a to give up	<i>Non rinuncio al caffè.</i>	I don't give up coffee.
riuscire a to manage/be able to	<i>Riesco sempre a sbagliare!</i>	I always manage to get things wrong!
servire a to serve a purpose	<i>Questa chiave mi serve ad aprire la porta.</i>	This key helps me to open the door / I use this key to open the door.
tenere a to care to/about	<i>Ci teniamo a te.</i>	We care about you.



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Verbs followed by DA

allontanarsi da to get away/leave	<i>Mi allontano dalla gente.</i>	I am getting away from people.
copiare da to copy	<i>Copio la ricetta da internet.</i>	I copy the recipe from internet.
difendere da to defend	<i>Mi difendo dalle bugie.</i>	I defend myself against these lies.
dipendere da to depend on	<i>Dipende dal tempo.</i>	It depends on the weather.
proteggersi da to protect oneself from	<i>Mi proteggo dal freddo.</i>	I protect myself from the cold.
tradurre da... a(l) to translate from... into	<i>Traduco dal russo all'italiano.</i>	I translate from Russian into Italian.



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IMPORTANT! Do you want to know a secret that can make you feel like a native speaker?
Check out these verbs and how they take different prepositions to give special information!

cominciare	Comincia a piovere. It is starting to rain.		Comincio da capo. I start from the beginning	
credere	Credo agli UFO. I believe in UFOs. (in the existence)	Credo di capire. I think I understand.		Credo in te. I believe in you. (I trust you.)
finire	Finisco a lavare i piatti! I end up washing dishes!	Finisco di studiare. I'm done studying.		
parlare	Parlo al telefono. I talk on the phone.	Parlo di sport. I talk about sports.		
pensare	Penso a mio padre. I think about my father.	Penso di uscire. I think I'll go out.
