Common verbs with accidental se



Verb	Meaning	Example	Translation
<i>caer</i>	to drop, to fall	<i>Se me cayó la bolsa.</i>	I dropped the bag.
<i>perder</i>	to lose	<i>¿Cuándo se te perdió tu perro?</i>	When did you lose your dog?
<i>olvidar</i>	to forget	<i>A mis amigos se les olvidó mi cumpleaños.</i>	My friends forgot about my birthday.
<i>romper</i>	to break	<i>La lámpara se nos rompió.</i>	We broke the lamp.
<i>dañar</i>	to break down	<i>El radio se nos dañó.</i>	We broke down the radio.
<i>quebrar</i>	to break	<i>Los platos se nos quebraron.</i>	We broke the dishes.
<i>quedar</i>	to leave something behind	<i>Se les quedaron las maletas en el aeropuerto.</i>	They left their suitcases behind at the airport.
<i>descomponer</i>	to break down, to stop working	<i>El computador se le descompuso al señor Martínez.</i>	Mr. Martínez's computer broke down.
<i>ensuciar</i>	to get dirty	<i>Siempre que salimos se te ensucian los zapatos.</i>	Whenever we go out, your shoes get dirty.
<i>acabar</i>	to run out of something	<i>Qué raro. Se me acabaron las galletas.</i>	That's weird. I ran out of cookies.
<i>quemar</i>	to burn	<i>¿Se te quemaron las empanadas?</i>	Did you burn the empanadas?
<i>derramar</i>	to spill	<i>Mamá, se me derramó el jugo de naranja.</i>	Mom, I spilled the orange juice.

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
