<i>aburrir</i>	to get bored	<i>Me aburren las novelas románticas.</i> I get bored with romantic novels.
<i>agradar</i>	to please	<i>Me agrada la música country.</i> Country music is pleasing to me.
<i>alegrar</i>	to make happy	<i>Me alegran tus visitas.</i> Your visits make me happy.
<i>apasionar</i>	to love	<i>Me apasionan los pasteles de chocolate.</i> I love chocolate cakes.
<i>apetecer</i>	to feel like	<i>Me apetece ir en bici.</i> I feel like riding a bike.
<i>atraer</i>	to attract	<i>Me atrae la idea de ir a Hawaii.</i> The idea of going to Hawaii is attractive to me.
<i>chocar</i>	to find strange/annoying	<i>Me choca su actitud.</i> I find his attitude strange.
<i>costar</i>	to find it hard	<i>Me cuesta comer fruta por la mañana.</i> I find it hard to eat fruit in the morning.
<i>disgustar</i>	to upset	<i>Me disgustó la noticia.</i> The news got me upset.
<i>doler</i>	to hurt	<i>Me duelen las piernas.</i> My legs hurt.
<i>encantar</i>	to love	<i>Me encantan las papas fritas.</i> I love fries.
<i>enojar</i>	to make somebody mad	<i>Me enoja tu comportamiento.</i> Your behavior makes me mad.

<i>faltar</i>	to lack	<i>Me faltan mis gatitos.</i> I miss my cats.
<i>fascinar</i>	to fascinate	<i>Me fascina la lectura.</i> Reading is fascinating.
<i>fastidiar</i>	to annoy	<i>Me fastidia tu decisión.</i> Your decision is annoying.
<i>horrorizar</i>	to horrify	<i>Me horroriza el examen.</i> The exam horrifies me.
<i>impresionar</i>	to impress	<i>Me impresionan sus pinturas.</i> Her drawings impress me.
<i>importar</i>	to be important	<i>Me importa tu opinión.</i> Your opinion is important to me.
<i>interesar</i>	to interest	<i>Me interesa el cine.</i> Cinema interests me.
<i>irritar</i>	to irritate	<i>Me irritan los ronquidos.</i> Snoring irritates me.
<i>molestar</i>	to bother	<i>Me molestan los gritos.</i> Yells bother me.
<i>preocupar</i>	to worry	<i>Me preocupa la tormenta.</i> The storm worries me.
<i>quedar</i>	to be left over, to fit	<i>Me queda mucho trabajo por hacer.</i> I have a lot of work left to do.
<i>repugnar</i>	to disgust	<i>Me repugna su discurso.</i> His speech is disgusting to me.
