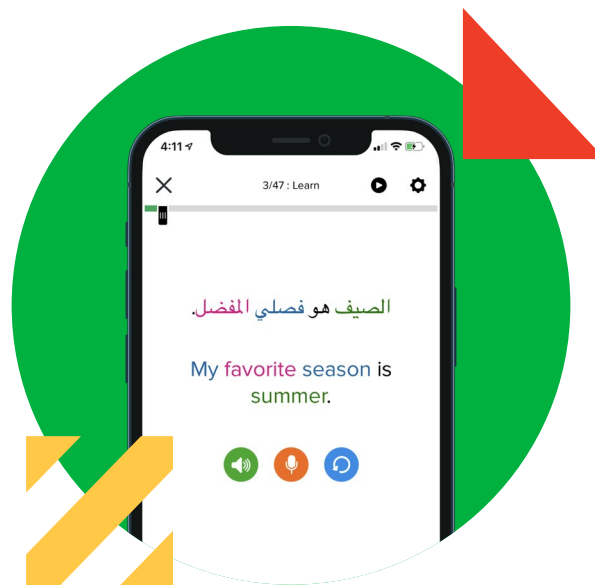

Hands-On Lesson Plans

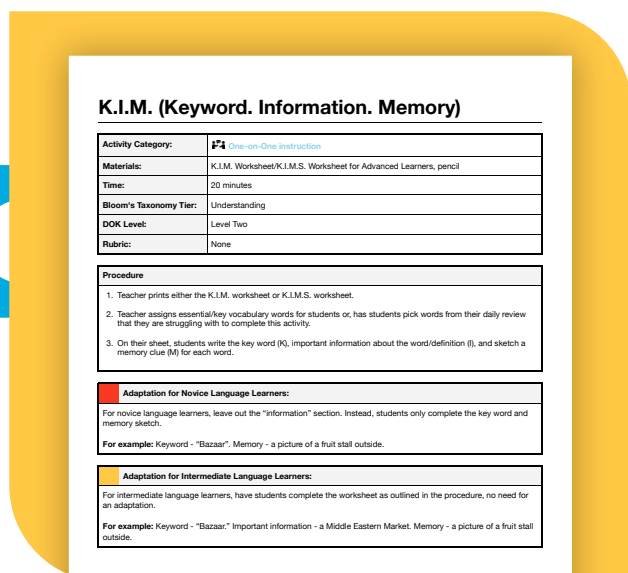

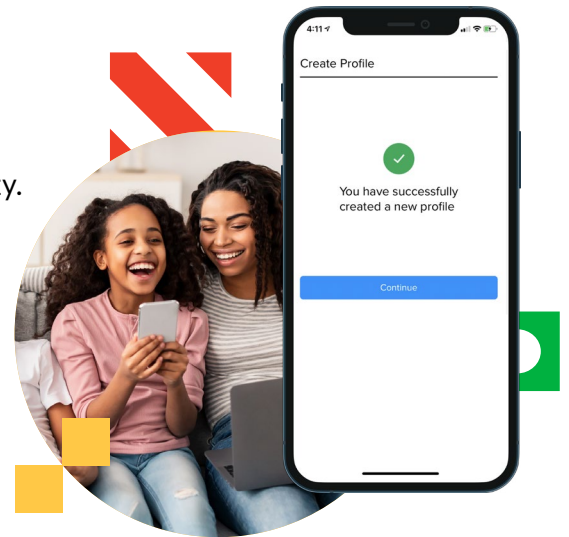


Family Profiles
