Digraphs are not part of the Spanish alphabet. They are two letters that represent one sound. *Ll* and *rr* overlap with *y* and *r*, respectively.

Rr is not usually used in upper case because it's only used between vowels. Words that begin with a "trill" (aka rolled *r*) are represented with a single *r*.

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
